MINUTES

Scholarships and Financial Aids Committee  
December 16, 1969

The Scholarships and Financial Aids Committee met on December 16, 1969, in Doane 203, at 4:00 P.M.

Those present: Robert W. Alritz, Albert Davison, Elizabeth Hartshorn, William Hoffman, Larry Ledebur, Neil Prentice, David Rice, Mark Smith, Charlotte Weeks, and Francis C. Bayley. The students present were Henry Durand, Thomas Jacobs, and Herbert Booker.

The minutes of the November 24 Meeting were approved as distributed.

William Hoffman moved that the sentence "In the senior year a reduction of 50% will be made in the Grant-in-Aid" of the "Statement of Policy" be deleted and the following sentence be substituted. "Grants-in-aid are not automatically renewable and may be partially or wholly replaced by loan funds at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee, primarily on the basis of academic performance." This motion was seconded by Neil Prentice. After discussion the motion was reworded as follows: "Grants-in-aid are not automatically renewable and may be partially or wholly replaced by loan funds at the discretion of the scholarship committee, especially in cases where academic performance fails to meet reasonable expectations." William Hoffman moved the passage of this motion and it was seconded by Neil Prentice and the motion was passed.

Mark Smith moved the following: "The University is committed to satisfying with gift aid the full financial need of each black student registered as a degree candidate." Elizabeth Hartshorn seconded the motion. The motion was carried.

The Scholarship Chairman was instructed to ask the Executive Committee for permission to be present when they consider the above motions.

David Rice moved for adjournment and Robert W. Alritz seconded the motion. The meeting adjourned at 5:45 P.M.
