Heidi I. Hartmann is currently director of the Washington-based
Institute for Women's Policy Research, a think tank on policy
issues of importance to women. In the Spring of 1988, she was
director of the women's studies program and professor of
Sociology at Rutgers University. During 1986-87 she held an
American Statistical Association fellowship at the Census Bureau
where she conducted research on women's poverty. For 8 years
previously she was a staff member of the National Research
Council/National Academy of Sciences where she contributed to
many reports on women's employment issues, including the 1981
report on pay equity, Women, Work, and Wages: Equal Pay for Jobs
of Equal Value. She also lectures and writes on the economics of
gender relations. She has a B.A. from Swarthmore College and
M.Ph. and Ph.D. degrees from Yale University, all in economics.
