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Commentary on "Revised Version of Thoughts on Jill Galvan's Interpretation of the Relationship between Government and Technology in Philip K. Dick's *Do Androids Dream of Electric Sheep?*"

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Thomas' writing is a great example of a student using a prompt in a class and tailoring to his own interests. This paper, initially for a W 101 course on mechanics, was meant to be an exercise in using primary and secondary sources in a writing assignment using a variety of provided sources. Thomas, a Global Commerce major and a computer science minor, was drawn to Phillip K. Dick's *Do Androids Dream of Electric Sheep?* because of his interest in science fiction. The paper seamlessly and fluid use of secondary sources rivals even the most experienced undergraduate writers, let alone first-year students. It is clear that Thomas' interest in the subject is what propelled him to write such an engaging and thought-provoking paper on the topic of government systems and technology.
