The Executive Committee of the faculty affirms that the teaching of classes shall be at the discretion of the individual faculty member. It is understood that a faculty member who chooses to cancel a class has an obligation to hold a make-up class.

As a matter of information,

The Executive Committee also reminds the community of the following policy which is part of the Statement on Dissent.

"The University cannot condone the use of force which endangers the physical welfare of individuals, violations of office privacy, blocking of traffic or prevention of free access to University buildings and rooms. Destruction of University property will not be tolerated. Malicious disruption of academic activities, public events or University programs is unacceptable, while behavior that causes no infringement upon the rights of individuals and assembled groups will be tolerated. Within the context of due process, individuals responsible for unacceptable behavior as defined above shall be subject to strong disciplinary measures, including suspension or dismissal from the University."
