Or, Why You Don't Have to Read Women's Writing to Know It's No Good**. Her presentation will focus on the implications of new technologies for women. She will discuss the transition from print to electronic media and will suggest that, just as women were excluded from the print-based world of dictionaries, grammar, and literature, they now face exclusion as a result of the new electronic technologies.

Dr. Sandler is presently Senior Associate with the Center for Women's Policy Studies in Washington, D.C. Her career has been devoted to working to establish equity for female students, faculty and administrators on U.S. college campuses. She was one of the significant shapers of Title IX, which established the basis for equality of opportunity for women in educational programs in the 1970's. She is also a major resource on a number of topics of concern to university women (both students and employees): sexual harassment and assault, the "chilly classroom," equality of opportunity for female athletes, pay equity, gender biases in faculty evaluations, etc.

During the day on Wednesday, Bernice has graciously agreed to be available to meet with groups and individuals for informal discussions. I will bring Bernice to lunch at Slayter Pit at 12 noon and you are welcome to join us then. You are also welcome to stop by for coffee and informal discussions from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. at the Faculty Lounge.
