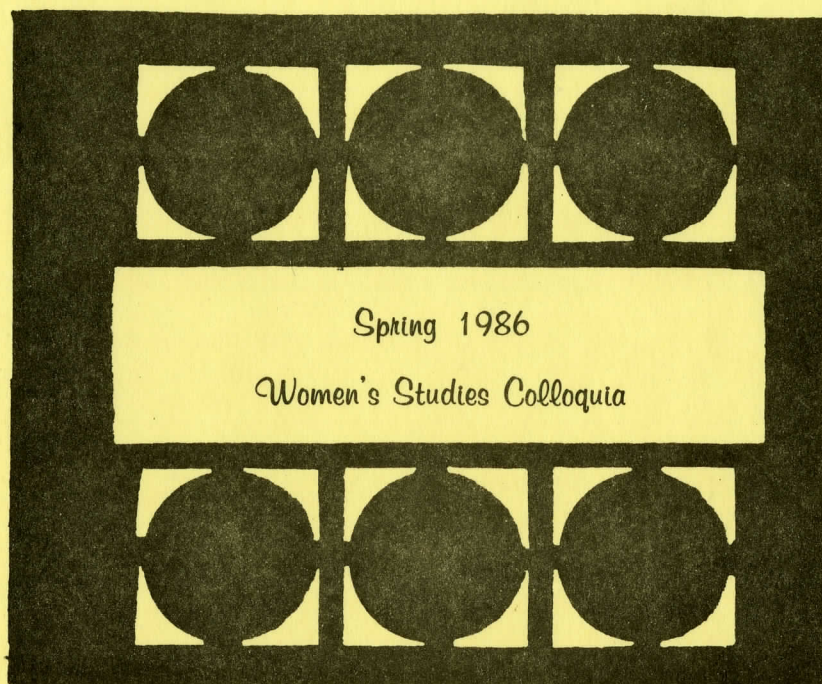

Some information on three different sources of funds is included below.

Special Lecturer's Fund:

Again this year funds have been budgeted for the Special Lecturer's fund. Chairpersons are encouraged to send their requests in writing to the Dean of the College to reserve funds for their department. A maximum of \$300 is the most any department should request.

This fund is used to bring speakers to campus to work with individual departments, classes, and programs. The guidelines for these funds are as follows:

1. Small honorarium (normally \$100 maximum)
2. Travel (normally within a 400 mile radius)
3. Lodging (use Middleton House)
4. Meals
 - a. We have encouraged use of the dininghalls so that students could meet the person also.
 - b. If the person is taken out to dinner or lunch we have tried to limit this to one other person, i.e. the guest lecturer and one person from the department.
 - c. The university will not cover any alcohol expenses.
5. Requests for payment, travel expense reports, etc., are to be approved by the Office of the Dean of the College.

Alumni/Parent Scholar Fund:

Chairpersons are encouraged to invite alumni/parent scholars to campus. Transportation costs and meals would be covered from this fund, but honoraria cannot be covered. Chairpersons should make their requests in writing to the Dean of the College. The guidelines for these funds are similar to those of the Special Lecturer's Fund--with the exception of the honoraria.

DURF Contingency Fund:

This is a special fund made possible by the Denison University Research Foundation, administered by the Dean of the College, in order to assist faculty members undertaking small research projects during the year. Requests for more than \$200 from DURF will have to be submitted for the DURF Board's consideration at their annual meeting which usually takes place in April. Requests for less than \$200 should be made in writing to the Dean of the College. If in doubt as to whether a particular project falls within the DURF Contingency guidelines, a quick call to the Office of the Dean (ext. 469) may be helpful.
